

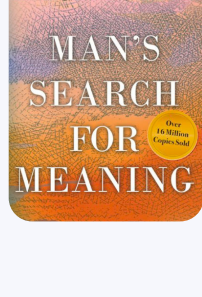
# 28 Pragmatics,

### 01. Man's Search for Meaning

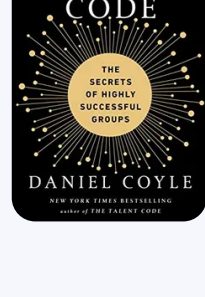

### 02. The Culture Code

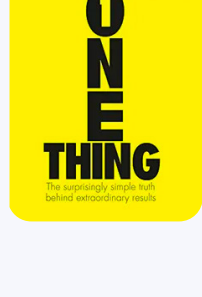
